Earlier, we talked about guarding your eyes and ears from things that you should not hear or see -- in order to guard your heart.

There are a number of ways to define purity. In the sense of your virtue as a young woman, we mean not only keeping yourself pure for marriage in a physical way, but also keeping your heart and mind unsullied by the things that degrade us as women, things that destroy your values, and things that divide your heart from God.

As we seek God, we need to clear away the obstacles that keep us from getting close to him. Jesus told his disciples that "the pure in heart shall see God."

Through the following articles on Purity, we will learn what it means to have a pure heart, what it takes to be clean in God's eyes, and how we can steer clear of the many pitfalls that every girl faces.

To begin with, as you understand what pure means, and its infinite value to you and your life's goals, you will realize the need to make a resolution - a pledge to stay pure. If we don't set standards for ourselves before we are faced with temptations, we set ourselves up to be trapped.

As you go through this study, think about the situations in your life where you might get into trouble, when it comes to guarding your purity. Then, think through exactly what you will do, and what you will say, to stand your ground.

Just like a soldier knows his strategies and exit plans before he runs into battle, you, in defense of your virtue, should have some absolutes that you set for yourself. You will find some suggestions in the section on dating...

When you finish this section, pray about and consider the Purity Pledge on the opposite page. Don't take it lightly. A pledge is a promise, and something more.

It doesn't take a strong person to go along with what everyone else is doing. Anyone can do what everyone else is doing. It takes a strong, brave woman to stand your ground, and stick to your principles under pressure. To be pure, you have to be brave and strong, first.

SEXUAL INTEGRITY

In an earlier section, we talked about integrity -- it means something is the same, through and through, reliable, solid, and pure. Having sexual integrity, then is something you simply cannot separate from your overall integrity -- your character involves your virtue.

Sexual integrity means you refuse to be weak and compromise your values, when it comes to romance, love, dating, all those situations that can lead to physical contact.

Proverbs 31, in describing a woman of value, asks,

"Who can find a virtuous woman? her value is far above rubies."

It's important to know that, at the time, rubies were more valued than diamonds.

In a day and age where we are ambushed by images of sex from every angle, and all of society tells us that our sexual identity IS our primary identity, we have to constantly weed out all the nonsense, and stick to some basic truths.

SEX IS NOT BAD

It's supposed to be special. It was designed to be part of a covenant -- the vows you and your husband make to God-something you share with your lifelong mate, not some random boy you go to school with. Not even the guy who you think might be "the one," and you hope to marry him someday.

It's like this: a blazing fire in the fireplace is beautiful, cozy, warm...where it belongs. But if it topples outside the fireplace, it turns into a hazard. Things get burned - people get hurt, even destroyed. It has to stay in the fireplace. Sex was meant to stay inside of marriage, because, outside of it, it's a hazard, instead of a pleasure.

FVERYTHING COUNTS

You can't say only certain things are "technically" sex, and other things are not. If it involves physical contact of any kind, with anything clothes are supposed to cover, it's sexual contact. It does count. Don't play word games with your purity. That's what a child does -- dance around the truth, so they can get away with things without being caught. If you're old enough to know about such "activities," then you're old enough to act like a woman, not a child, and face the facts for what they are.

PURITY = POWER

Other girls, or even boys, will make fun of you for being "scared" to experiment with sex, but they are wrong. Purity is power. It's something you choose, something you fight for, and something you resolve to maintain at any cost, to secure the amazing future God has planned for you. How could that be something to be ashamed of? Don't let others choose your future for you.

Women of true virtue, purity and integrity are rare and priceless, and have an overwhelming advantage in life over all their peers who are just "playing around."



PURITY IS A BATTLE YOU MUST WIN

Why is purity so important? First, because it is God's design, and plan. Second, your virginity is a powerful, priceless gift; something that you can give ONLY ONCE, and then it's gone.

But there are many good reasons by staying pure until you are married is really the best way. True love may only happen once in a lifetime, too. What if you give yourself away before you realize he's not "the one?"

There is a beautiful story we share with all of our Ladies of Honor girls when we talk about waiting for marriage. Yes, it's a fictional story, but even Jesus used stories to illustrate a point. If we build our expectations on fairy tales like Cinderella, why not listen to this one, and seriously think about what it means?

THE IMPATIENT PRINCESS

Once upon a time, not so long ago, in a land not so far away, there lived a beautiful young princess. She was loved, cared for, and taught great wisdom by her mother and father. She had every advantage a girl could possibly have -- brains, beauty, fortune, talent, popularity...yet, somehow, it was

not enough. Sunset after sunset, she sat by the window of her room in the tallest tower of the castle, looking out over the kingdom, sighing with loneliness.

"When will my prince ever come?" she wondered. Day after day, through all the parties, balls, and outings, she looked around her at the handsome men that often passed by. "I wonder if he's the one?" She thought. But none of them gave her more than a second look, or a second dance, or a stroll together in the garden...nothing ever bloomed into love.

She met her Prince Charming once, and it was magical...but he was called away on international duties, and had been long gone.

Satan wants to do anything and everything possible to destroy you. That's what it's all about. If you can be tempted with pornography, or lured away by a good looking guy, that's the mode of attack he will use.

And it's not just a fight for your body -- it's a fight for your soul. So if that's what it's all about, that's where you need to stand your ground and defend yourself, spiritually, taking up every spiritual weapon you can find to stand your ground.

"For the weapons of our warfare are not fleshly, but mighty through God to the pulling down of strongholds, pulling down imaginations, and every high thing that exalts itself against the knowledge of God, and bringing into captivity every thought into the obedience of Christ."

(2 Corinthians 10:4-5)

If you want to win this battle, you need to arm yourself well, with all the right tools:

Your Sword

Our most important defense is the Bible -- the Word of God is compared to a double-edged sword, sharp, powerful and quick to divide the truth from everything else. God's word never changes, and he never changes, so His word is what's called an absolute -- everything else should be measured by God's word, not the other way around. Read the Bible and learn what God has to teach you about overcoming every battle in your life. It is your most powerful weapon against enemy attacks.

YOUR SHIELD

Guard your eyes and your ears from things you know will "infect" you with the wrong kinds of ideas. How do you know its' wrong? It doesn't measure up against God's word.

Your Watch

Time. It's all about God's timing. Don't make the mistake of trying rush God's plan for your life. Don't wake love before it is time.

THINGS GROW BLOOM AND FLOURISH WHEN FED

Things grow when they are fed, and starve when they are not. Sexual desire is something that can be controlled, if you don't constantly feed it by entertaining thoughts about it. We do have the power to say "no" to those thoughts and weaken the desire.

An Indian chief once told his daughter, "I have two dogs fighting inside of me, one very dark and evil, one very strong and good."

"Which one wins?" his daughter asked. He replied,
"The one I feed the most."

We have two natures inside of us, battling for control. One is described in the Bible as the "flesh." This is our sinful nature -- our instincts toward selfishness, desire, anger, all those things we know cause us to sin. The other one is our spirit.

Jesus once said "The spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak." How true that is for so many things! Our spirit tells us it's right to wait until after dinner for that box of cookies that's calling our name...our flesh wants to eat the whole box of cookies right now!

If we feed and follow our flesh -- by feed, we mean indulge, give in to, spoil, etc. -- then our flesh gets stronger, and becomes the driving force in

our lives. It will always lead us to ruin. This is how people wind up with addictions, anger issues, and self-destructive lifestyles. They are feeding the bad dog with the wrong kinds of movies, music, conversations, thoughts, and probably following through with actions that get them into trouble deeper and deeper.

The thing to do, every day, is to feed your spirit, first and foremost. Remember when we talked about the transformation chamber? How you need to start fresh every day by putting down your own desires, and committing to take up your cross to follow Christ? It is an onging thing -- you can never stop, if you want to win this battle.

How do we feed the spirit?

- -Read the Bible

4. REAL WOMEN REQUIRE RESPE

YOUR PRINCE WILL KNOW HOW TO TREAT YOU LIKE A PRINCESS

Real men honor women. The entire code of Chivalry dictates that a man use all his capabilities to protect and honor women.

A wise woman, and former first lady, once said that no one can treat you badly without your permission. This goes for friends, guys, and everyone, but mostly guys, for the purpose of this lesson.

It's pretty simple. If you don't want to be treated like a plaything, or a woman with no value, 1) don't behave or present yourself like one; and

2) don't tolerate being treated like one.

The conflict happens when we send boys mixed messages. Once, a teenage girl I know wore a very short skirt to class. As her brother sat down across from her, he was very blunt about it "that skirt is so short I can see your underpants!" She was furious at being called out. Now, he didn't exactly handle it like a gentleman, but he was very young.

"WHY are you looking??" she demanded, defending her outfit.

"WHY are you showing us everything?" he replied.

That was a completely honest, male response. Boys are going to be tempted to look. If you don't want them looking at you like that, don't give them anything to look AT, I instructed her.

Cover up. Make sure your skirts and shorts are long enough, and your shirts are the right size, etc. to cover yourself up. Your body is to be guarded and cherished, not flaunted, as if it's nothing valuable.

If you had a hundred dollar bill, you would make sure it was well hidden, whether it's in your pocket, your purse, or inside your bra, so no one could take it without your permission. Isn't your body more valuable than that?

Guys battle with sexual thoughts, too. If you dress in a way that provokes them, aren't you participating in the enemy's attempts to trap them? Don't be a tool.

And, good grief, don't ever, ever take revealing pictures of yourself and send them to anyone. You have no control at all, after that image has been put out there, and then it is out there forever! Embarrassing photos like that have ruined many lives, and many futures.

Another way we earn respect is by acting like a lady. A Lady of Honor, ideally, but certainly, like a lady.



When it comes to the way you dress, especially, you want the freedom to express yourself. That can be a beautiful, fun thing--a thing to be encouraged and embraced.

But, at the same time, while you are "expressing yourself," you should always think about WHAT you are expressing. If your appearance was a message, what would it say about you? Do you spend too much, or too little time composing that message? Are you presenting yourself in a way that says you are valuable, or cheap?

Don't take the easy exit out of this conversation. Christian girls are too likely to pull out the scripture that says "Don't judge by appearance...the Lord looks at the heart." You should read the first book of Samuel, and understand the context of that verse, before you use it to defend your inappropriate outfit.

In that passage, God was telling the prophet Samuel not to pass over David, the common looking little teenager, the youngest brother, who seemed the least likely choice for the next King of Israel. If it were a popularity contest, David's older brothers would have been chosen, as tried-and-true warriors, tall and rugged and good-looking. They looked like Kings, but David was the young man "after God's own heart," and God could see that the shepherd boy/musician had the makings of a champion on the inside.

God looks, and judges, deeper than man's definition of "capable" in order to redefine an ordinary person into a hero. That's what he meant by looking at the heart, instead of the outward appearance.

So, we really should value what's on the inside, and see people the way God sees them.

On the other hand, we need to remember something that's more important than anything else. If you have truly given your heart and life to Jesus, then sending HIS message will be far more important than sending your own. Remember that he is in you, and with you, and that you represent him to others who DON'T know Him, and don't know you, either.

If He lives in Us, we belong to Him. We should treat our bodies and dress our bodies with the respect and care we feel for God.

REMEDY: MIRROR CHECK

An age-old way to decide whether your outfit should get the thumbs up, or not: It is a little trick classic designer Coco Chanel related, in the middle of a fashion fad when women tended to go a little crazy with accessories.

The rule was to look in the mirror, and the first thing that catches your eye, well it has to go. She was kind of a minimalist, but her idea was on target -- the focus should be YOU, not your jewelry, scarves, etc.

The standard has softened today: a little pop of color is fun, but do not be tempted to over-do it.

To add something more to that, when you do that last mirror check, ask the Lord, is there anything I am wearing that does not please you? Then listen to your heart.,


Ten Top "Making a Statement" Mistakes

- 1. Too small It's ironic, but wearing clothes that are too tight actually do not make you look smaller. They are often immodest, and not comfortable, either. Know your size, and wear it.
- 2. Too big The key element in art is balance. If you're wearing a baggy blouse, wear fitted pants, skinny jeans, or a pencil skirt. If you're waring a full skirt, wear a more tailored or fitted blouse. Wearing all baggy clothes can be comfy, but they will never look neat together.
- 3. Clothes that clash You can mix florals with geometrics, but never geometrics with geometrics, or different florals. Stick to one theme, and keep all the background pieces subtle.
- 4. Overstatement We all love a little neon or animal print, but like a rich dessert, a little should go a

- long way. Instead of overdoing it, and taking the attention away from your simple beauty, pick one little statement piece, and simplify the rest of the outfit.
- 5. Too effortless No girl should look as if she just tumbled out of bed and threw on some random clothes. Pick out something neat and clean, and make yourself presentable, no mater where you go. You never know whom you'll meet!
- 6. Wrong place wrong time Don't wear a black party dress to a funeral, just because it's black, and don't wear your hanging-out-with-friends worn out jeans to go with your mom to her office, or to visit her friends. Present yourself in a way that says you're somebody important, too, and that you know what's what --what's right.
- 7. Impractical If you know your outing involves a lot of walking, leave the high heels at home and opt for some pretty sandals.


- 8. Should be retired Some things can be mended, and others can't. If your favorite old graphic tee is looking faded and falling apart, retire it.





- 3. Let others go first. That goes for conversation, a place in line, or an opportunity to shine. Let others have their say, and have their way. Most such things don't matter that much -- and you will be remembered as the kind, gracious girl, instead of the pushy girl.
- 4. Never leave a mess. If you pass a discarded candy wrapper in the hall, throw it away. If you leave crumbs on the counter, clean them up. You want to leave an impression wherever you go, but a good one. Return things you borrow promptly, and in clean, good condition. Offer to help do the dishes, when you are a guest. Always leave a place better than you found it.
- 5. Take the lead, when it's proper. When you're in a situation where people don't know each other, or don't get along well, be the one who can put an end to the awkward silence. Start, and lead, a cheerful conversation on something you know interests everyone, and draw the others in with leading questions until everyone is talking together comfortably.
- 6. Speak up, speak clearly, and speak well. Read, research, and pay attention to grown-up conversations so that you can speak



Intelligently with them. Don't talk too fast, or use slang, or slouch or look down when you talk. Stand up straight, and look them in the eye, like you have something to say, worth hearing, and you will be taken seriously. Be respectful; don't argue. Know when to graciously keep quiet. Conversation isn't supposed to be a debate--it's supposed to be a manner of learning about each other. Listen, more than you speak, and think about the consequences of your words, before you say them. These are the elements that define mature conversation.

- 7. Sit like a lady. Knees together, whether you are wearing a skirt or not. Sit up, shoulders back. When an adult approaches you, rise to your feet.
- 8. Dine like a lady. Always place a napkin in your lap. Always bless

your food. Never talk with your mouth full, or make any noises of any kind. Never discuss anything at the table that you would not put ON the table. Never spit out anything, complain about the food, or make faces. Eat slowly and chew silently. Always thank your host/hostess for the meal, compliment the cook, and, when you are finished, lay your utensils across your plate and lay your napkin over them.

- 9. Dress like a lady. Modesty should rule your wardrobe. Don't wear t-shirts with obnoxious words or images, and make sure you are dressed right for the type of occasion.
- 10. Never correct others. Never correct someone else's grammar or manners. According to every standard and guide, this is one of the biggest offenses of all, when it comes to good etiquette.

The important part to understand about courting is that the courting relationship is a structured relationship where both people are accountable to their parents, their leaders, and to the Lord.



REALITY CHECK: ARE YOU TRULY, PURELY DEVOTED?

HOW PURELY DEVOTED ARE YOU TO FOLLOWING CHRIST?

The #1 thing teens say they hate is someone who a fake -- a hypocrite.

Yet, if you haven't given God your WHOLE heart, you can't honestly call yourself a follower of Christ.

Jesus said only the pure in heart would see God. (Matthew 5:8) and that you cannot serve two masters. You will hate one, and love the other. (Matthew 6:24) If you want to serve God, and truly follow Christ, you must give him ALL your heart, and stop dancing on the edge of commitment.

Something certain about people who dance on the edge - they are sure to fall off at some point--and it's usually a pretty bad fall.

So, how do you serve him with ALL your heart? First you must make a decision to break free of past, and start your new future. We can't still do the things we used to do, and expect to have the joy that comes from the gift of a new life in Christ. If you're trying to do both, that's why you're so miserable.

There is nothing we leave behind that is any good, compared to what we look forward to, if we will fully give our hearts to Him. Begin by making sure you understand God's expectations. Galatians 5 gives some pretty specific instructions, and clear idea of which characteristics belong to which side:

13 For you have been called to live in freedom, my brothers and sisters. But don't use your freedom to satisfy your sinful nature. Instead, use your freedom to serve one another in love...16 So I say, let the Holy Spirit guide your lives. Then you won't be doing what your sinful nature craves. 17 The sinful nature wants to do evil, which is just the opposite of what the Spirit wants. And the Spirit gives us desires that are the opposite of what the sinful nature desires. These two forces are constantly fighting each other, so you are not free to carry out your good intentions... 19 When you follow the desires of your sinful nature, the results are very clear: sexual immorality, impurity, lustful pleasures, 20 idolatry, sorcery, hostility, quarreling, jealousy, outbursts of anger, selfish ambition, dissension, division, 21 envy, drunkenness, wild parties, and other sins like these. Let me tell you again, as I have before, that anyone living that sort of life will not inherit the Kingdom of God. 22 But the Holy Spirit produces this kind of fruit in our lives: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, 23 gentleness, and self-control. There is no law against these things! 24 Those who belong to Christ Jesus have nailed the passions and desires of their sinful nature to his cross and crucified them there. 25 Since we are living by the Spirit, let us follow the Spirit's leading in every part of our lives.
